#### A Message from Pastor Cho:

My dear beloved sisters and brothers in Christ Jesus,

One of the memorable and inspirational experiences of my one month long staying in Europe was visiting the Taizé community in Taizé, France, from where the Taizé prayer service was originated. I found that about 100 monks live in the community, and it is open to anyone who would like to take a retreat for a week. Every week during the summer time, I was told, about one thousand youth spend a week long retreat, including joining the monks for the prayer service three times a day, participating in Bible study, observing a silent meditation in the afternoon and also laboring in love, such as gardening, repairing, cooking, dish washing, constructing,



etc. Even though my stay in the community was brief, it was a fresh time of renewal, rest and recreation to be remembered as long as I live.

We are blessed to have the Taizé prayer service at Fairfield Grace UMC. A special thanks goes to Dot Daruka, who has been faithful in preparing and leading the service for the last 6 years as the prayer service leader. Her gentle and inviting leadership is a true blessing to all of



us. "What makes you keep going with your ministry at FGUMC?" one of my colleagues asked me the other day. "The Taizé Prayer Service on Wednesday" was my response. The time to enter and pray in our beautiful and inviting Sanctuary has been a well from which I draw fresh water to quench my

thirst and a table where I get food for my hunger. It is a holy time to give thanks to the Lord for the opportunity to live and serve with you as disciples of Jesus Christ at FGUMC and also persistently "ask the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest." (Matthew 9:37) Come and join me and others for this precious time, a time with Jesus Christ, our Lord and our God (John 20:28)

#### 2015 Consecration Sunday Is Coming...

Congregations that approach financial stewardship from a biblical perspective do not view the money Christians give to their church merely as a way to pay its bills. Rather, such congregations see financial contributions as a way to help people grow spiritually in their relationship with God by supporting their church's mission and ministry with a percentage of their incomes.

Our congregation's finance/stewardship teams have selected the *New Consecration Sunday Stewardship Program* as a way to teach the biblical and spiritual principles of generous giving in our stewardship education emphasis this year.

New Consecration Sunday is based on the biblical philosophy of the need of the giver to give for his or her own spiritual development, rather than on the need of the church to receive. Instead of treating people like members of a social club who should pay dues, we will treat people like followers of Jesus Christ who want to give unselfishly as an act of discipleship. New Consecration Sunday encourages people toward proportionate and systematic giving in response to the question, "What percentage of my income is God calling me to give?"

During morning worship on Consecration Sunday on November 22nd, we are asking our attendees and members to make their financial commitments to our church's missionary, benevolent, and educational ministries in this community and around the world.

Every attendee and member who completes an *Estimate of Giving Card* does so voluntarily by attending morning worship on Consecration Sunday. We urge people to attend who feel strongly opposed to completing a card. The procedure is done in such a way that no one feels personal embarrassment if he or she chooses not to fill out a card.

We will do no home solicitation to ask people to complete cards. During morning worship our guest leader will conduct a brief period of instruction and inspiration, climaxed by members making their commitments as a confidential act of worship.

We will encourage participation in Consecration Sunday events through the Consecration Sunday team and church council members. Since we will make no follow-up visits to ask people to complete their cards, we will make every effort to inform, inspire, and commit everyone to attend Consecration Sunday worship.


