
ously what we have been doing for the last 60 years. We are here as God's creation to share the joy of living with the risen Christ and one another.

#### A LETTER FROM THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

March 28, 2016

Greetings in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ,

Peace be with you and God's blessings on you and your family.

As you are probably aware, our church has been faced with a series of major repairs that the trustees have worked diligently to resolve.

- ♦ The leak in the pipes for the zone that feeds Fellowship Hall, the church offices and much of the nursery school as well as upgrades to the heating system physical plant cost us over \$18,000.
- ♦ The slate roof and snow rail repairs will cost us approximately \$12,500.
- ♦ The gas line to our kitchen began to leak and had to be replaced at a cost of \$2,780.
- ♦ The oak and maple trees, which fell in the front yard, were removed at a cost of \$2,000.
- \$3,100 Nursery School heaters; due to issues with our heating system we needed to install electric back-up heaters in the Nursery School Classrooms to ensure that the state mandated minimum temperature was always met.
- ♦ We are also faced with some additional issues that must be addressed such as the fire suppressant system for the stove in the kitchen which will cost approximately \$3,000 to bring up to code. Our flat roofs will need to be re-coated this summer, which will cost us several thousand dollars just in materials.

The cost for the work that has been completed and that for which has been contracted is over \$38,000. As you can imagine this has greatly depleted the Trustee funds used for the upkeep of our church. I believe the Trustees have worked very diligently to be good stewards of what God has given us. All the projects were essential for the church facilities to meet the requirements of those using it, all of us plus the Nursery School. These types of projects do not come out of our General Operating Budget that Martha Wood oversees as our Treasurer.

Some of the Money to complete the required projects will have to come from funds that were not designated for repairs and maintenance. The Trustees and I are asking that you prayerfully consider a special offering to help restore our project funds and so we can move forward to be responsible stewards of the church God has given us. Enclosed is an envelope to be used for your special offering. Donations can be made between now and September.

I want to extend an invitation to church members to come in and read to our children. Please let me know if you are interested in doing this and we can arrange a date!



## Paper Shredding Day Saturday, May 14, 2016




